Fast forward 40 odd years ...

There is no doubt that learning has changed! Rather than expressed knowledge, greater respect is given to the application of learning to solve problems and set directions. A computer is an essential part of learning and we are now moving into the realm of artificial intelligence (A1)

The reason that this is being mentioned is that this form of technology will tempt students and it may be to the detriment of their learning. We. humans, cannot stop the progress of technology, but the pitfalls must be understood so that technology has a proper place in the process of learning. All can be a great tool for learning, but it is one that should not encourage plaragrism or direct copying from the "Bot" response. Students through their learning in SoN will be shown how to stimulate thought using AI as a means to encourage growth and stimulate original thought.

School of Now had some fantastic results last year where approximately 40% of our students recieved Band 5 or high, and most students recieved early offers from university prior to sitting their HSC exams.
